

SMBC School Ministry Launches 8th Year of Service at St. Matthews Elementary School

On August 13, some 60 representatives of the SMBC School Ministry Team gathered in the school cafeteria with the teachers and staff at St. Matthews Elementary School, for a celebratory breakfast on the day before students reported for the 2019-20 school year. The stated purpose of the assembly was to introduce new, and reunite returning, Volunteer Tutors and Classroom Helpers from SMBC, to the teacher in whose classroom they would serve for the coming year. Like every family reunion, the centerpiece of the event was food!
